About the Instructor

Rudy Martens is currently full professor in general and strategic management and since 2011 also dean of the Faculty of Applied Economics at the University of Antwerp, Belgium. He is also active at the Antwerp Management School (Belgium), of which he was director for executive education from 2000 till 2005.

Course Description

The course offers a general introduction into the nature of organizations and the management of these organizations. The major issues which will be discussed are: organizational structures and processes, managerial decision making processes, organizational culture, power phenomena in organizations and the impact of the environment on organizational functioning.

The course aims to create an awareness of the many different 'lenses' or perspectives through which organizations can be analyzed. As such, it provides the student with a systemic understanding of the functioning and the management of organizations. The main focus is the systematic analysis of the effectiveness of the organization.

To illustrate the theoretical insights and models, several cases will be used. Students are expected to have read the case studies and the indicated literature before the start of each session.

Syllabus



Several articles of academic journals (in English) and some chapters out of well-known textbooks on management and organization theory.

Also a bundle of 5 (relatively short) cases.

Required Text

Bundle of readings and cases will be made available.
