#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course will survey the history of World Civilization from human origins up through the end of the 15<sup>th</sup> century. We will explore the economic, social, political, religious, and cultural dimensions of the diffusion of civilization around the globe.

Although the class is primarily a lecture, I invite questions and try to convert my lectures into conversations. Feel free to ask questions, especially about parts of the readings that are difficult. I will also pose questions to the class to stimulate class discussion.

This class will focus on the connection between primary source materials and the textbook. At times, you will be challenged by the original sources that are sometimes difficult to read, but at the same time your intellect and creativity will be stimulated to real historical insight from the documents we are reading together. Class participation on the part of every student will help us realize this goal. All three paper assignments will analyze primary source materials. Your task will be to show how a given document contains ideas, facts, details that reflect on the general nature of the period during which it was written as described in the textbook. Your papers should cite passages from the document directly, showing how a given passage relates to its historical time period. You should not write a book report, or try to evaluate the work as a whole from a literary point of view. Because of this methodology, primary source documents will often form the basis of class discussion.
